Matthew 28:19-20

WELCOME

Whether this is your first time at St. Matthew or your thousandth, we're delighted you're worshipping with us! Think of your worship experience with us today as if you were dropping in on a conversation already in progress – a conversation between God and His people. Realize this is a conversation that began long before any of us were born and will continue long after all of us have passed. So, do not be surprised if there are some things that you do not understand right away. Because for a brief moment today, you're stepping into a continual stream of worship (in heaven and on earth) that reaches back into ancient times, continues today, and will be offered into eternity. So, let's drop in on this conversation, for today God is here giving you His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation, found only in Jesus Christ.

FAMILIES IN WORSHIP

During worship we like to have our kids with us. It's how they learn how to worship – from mom and dad. If they cry, wiggle, or fuss, don't worry! They are an important part of God's Church too. Always know that all parents have been where you're at before. It is important you stick with it. In fact, try sitting in front so they can watch what is going on. That said, if you feel you need somewhere quiet, there is a nursery available to which an usher can direct you, as well as a changing station in the bathroom next to the nursery. Also, St. Matthew has quiet bags for children in the North Common play area. Check them out!

CELEBRATING HOLY COMMUNION TODAY

As St. Matthew celebrates Holy Communion today, we ask both guests and members to fill out the WELCOME card you received today with your bulletin, with our guests giving special attention to our church family's communion beliefs and practice detailed on the back of the card. Please hand your card to the usher as you go up to communion.

St. Paul instructs us in 1 Corinthians 11:28-29 that we are to prepare ourselves to receive the Lord's Supper. Ways we can prepare today include:

- ✝ Reflect on the Ten Commandments (Hymnal, pgs. 321-322)
- ✝ Meditate on the purpose of Communion (Hymnal, pgs. 326-327)
- ✝ Read the Christian Questions & Answers (Hymnal, pgs. 329-330)
- ✝ Read penitential psalms (Hymnal, front - Psalm 51, 32, 130, etc.)
- ✝ Use suitable written prayers (Hymnal, inside front cover)
- ✝ Read confession or communion hymns (Hymnal, hymns 606-643)

BEFORE WORSHIP

St. Matthew enjoys all the warmth and conversation that goes along with being a loving church family. Yet, also please remember to observe the prayerful atmosphere of this holy place, leaving the time during the prelude music for people to pray and prepare for worship in the sanctuary, and silencing your electronic devices.

Also, refrain from bringing food and drink (with the exception of water) into the sanctuary of the Lord's house. Thank you.

DURING WORSHIP

QUESTIONS/DIRECTIONS: If you have any questions or need any directions (restrooms/elevator/nursery/changing station, etc.), please ask an usher and they can assist you.

LARGE PRINT BULLETINS & LISTENING DEVICES: For those who are visually or hearing impaired, large print bulletins and audio devices are available with the ushers in the back.

STANDING/KNEELING DURING WORSHIP/COMMUNION: Please only stand as able during our worship service or kneel as able at the communion rail. If you are unable to come forward for communion, notify an usher, and communion will be brought to your pew.

GLUTEN-REDUCED WAFERS & ALCOHOL-REDUCED WINE: For those with allergies or require an alcohol-reduced option, both gluten-reduced wafers and alcohol-reduced wine are available. Gluten-reduced wafers are kept separate in small individual bags. Just signal the pastor at the rail you require one. The alcohol-reduced wine is red in the individual cup tray. Just take one as needed.

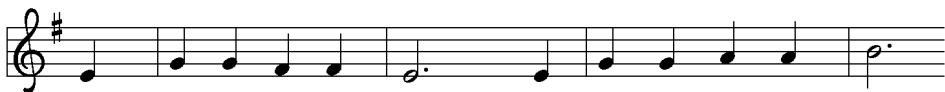

OLD TESTAMENT

1 Kings 19:9b-21

P The Old Testament Lesson for the Third Sunday After Pentecost is from 1 Kings, chapter 19.

Behold, the word of the LORD came to [Elijah], and he said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁰He said, "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. For the people of Israel have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword, and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away." ¹¹And he said, "Go out and stand on the mount before the LORD." And behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind tore the mountains and broke in pieces the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. And after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. ¹²And after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire the sound of a low whisper. ¹³And when Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. And behold, there came a voice to him and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁴He said, "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. For the people of Israel have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword, and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away." ¹⁵And the LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus. And when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael to be king over Syria. ¹⁶And Jehu the son of Nimshi you shall anoint to be king over Israel, and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint to be prophet in your place. ¹⁷And the one who escapes from the sword of Hazael shall Jehu put to death, and the one who escapes from the sword of Jehu

shall Elisha put to death. ¹⁸Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him."

¹⁹So he departed from there and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, who was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen in front of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and cast his cloak upon him. ²⁰And he left the oxen and ran after Elijah and said, "Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?" ²¹And he returned from following him and took the yoke of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the yokes of the oxen and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he arose and went after Elijah and assisted him.

Galatians 5:1,13-25

P The Epistle is from Galatians, chapter 5.

¹For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. . . .

¹³For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. ¹⁴For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁵But if you bite and devour one another, watch out that you are not consumed by one another.

¹⁶But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you

want to do. ¹⁸But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. ¹⁹Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, ²⁰idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, ²¹envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. ²²But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

²⁵If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit.
